



SPECIAL POPULATIONS







- 15% year-over-year performance increase




ACADEMIC PROGRESS

NCPA's goals for the 2022-23 school year were to:


- Establish a trauma-sensitive school structure
- Refine & clarify a RTI trauma-sensitive process to best support students
- Academic growth

NCPA achieved all goals by focusing on trauma-informed practices such as allocating resources to support student needs such as hiring an Intervention Specialist and multiple Behavioral Intervention Specialists. The school additionally implemented a school-wide PBIS program and implemented RTI more rigorously. These changes were effective in increasing academic performance. NCPA increased its PI score by over 15% and achieved 3 stars in Progress for meeting state expectations for student growth.

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance. Additionally, St. Aloysius has a regular presence at school board meetings where student performance indicators such as attendance, behavior, and academic achievement are tracked and financial and organizational issues that impact student success are reviewed and discussed. Key to the oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance is St. Aloysius' review of the school's Ohio Improvement Process (OIP) plan development and implementation. As a result of our thorough oversight and monitoring, St. Aloysius has determined that this school is substantially compliant with the rules and regulations governing community schools.

All community school sponsors are required to submit a written report of the evaluation results of the school's academic, financial, and organizational performance, as well as the school's legal compliance with Ohio Revised Code, Ohio Administrative Code, and to the terms of the Community School contract.
